INTRODUCCION

En *Anales*, Nº 123 (1961), págs. 131-141, el profesor Homero Castillo ofrece una recopilación de las tesis doctorales sobre temas relacionados con la América Hispana y su producción literaria que se habían efectuado en los planteles universitarios de los Estados Unidos hasta 1959. Celebramos tener a mano tal ordenación metódica de las tesis doctorales. Así, por fin, existe una manera efectiva de ubicar a algún autor o tópico sin hacer una revisión ardua y fastidiosa de veintenas de tomos de varias publicaciones.

La labor del profesor Castillo es indispensable para cuantos se interesen por las letras americanas. Pero sobre todo ayudará al estudiante graduado y a su director de estudios a decidir si cierto tema representa una contribución original o duplica la labor de otro investigador.

El trabajo que ofrecemos a continuación tiene por motivo facilitar no sólo los títulos omitidos en la lista original, sino también añadir los que se han anunciado a partir de 1959. Tenemos la esperanza de que juntamente las dos listas abarquen la completa producción de tesis sobre temas hispanoamericanos hasta principios de 1964.

En cuanto a la presentación seguimos la forma admirablemente sencilla que inició el profesor Castillo. También incluimos un índice general de temas, autores y países tratados, directores de tesis y los planteles universitarios donde se hallan inéditos los trabajos.
